After School Clubs

- Handwriting Club This club helps develop and enhance the skills needed for legible handwriting.
- Lexia PowerUp This is a program for non-proficient readers. It accelerates the development of both fundamental literacy and higher-order thinking skills, through adaptive learning paths.
- Lexia Core5 This aims to build foundational reading skills for students through personalised learning. The program focuses on six aspects of reading instruction: phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, and structural analysis.
- Literacy Intervention This is a short-term intervention that provides intensive, small-group instruction, which supplements classroom literacy teaching. The goal is to lift the literacy achievement of students who are not achieving grade-level expectations in reading.
- Numeracy Intervention These sessions build students' skills and knowledge of key mathematical concepts, which can then help their understanding in maths lessons.
- **Dyslexia Club** Sessions will include training in letter sounds, phoneme awareness, and linking letters and phonemes through writing and reading from texts at the appropriate level to reinforce emergent skills.
- Speech, Language and Communication Needs Supports children with reading and writing and enables them to access the whole curriculum. It also helps with communication skills, which will help children to make sense of the world around them.
- English as an Additional Language This club aims to help EAL students:
 - 1) Use English confidently and competently
 - 2) Use English as a means to learning across the curriculum
 - 3) Where appropriate, make use of their knowledge of other languages
