- Undertaken primary school visits
- Planned the transition days for Wednesday 10th, Thursday 11th and Friday 12th July.

Transition Days

Wednesday 10, Thursday 11 & Friday 12 July

- 8:20am – students gather in groups outside the front main school entrance
- Day finishes at 3:00pm
- Students to make their own travel arrangements to and from school
- Students will be informed of their form groups
- Most ambitious programme ever this year
- Experience from a wide range of subject areas all across school
- Lots for students to do, see and enjoy
- Chance to meet teachers, other students and find way around school

Transition Day Lunch

- Children will be expected to bring their own packed lunch to the transition day
- Lunch will be provided for those children already entitled to free school meals

Some Key Differences between Primary and Secondary School

- Wider range of subjects than in primary school
- Taught by lots of different teachers (subject specialists)
- Taught either in mixed ability groups or set groups
- Students move from department to department for lessons
- Homework in most subjects each week
- Planners to organise themselves.
- Range of extra-curricular activities (clubs & trips)

Biometric System

PRAISE Code

- Our principal aim is to encourage high expectations and high standards of achievement, both academic and personal.

The Student Planner

- On arrival at Jesmond Park Academy your child will be given a student planner.
- This is their passport into the school.
- They must carry it with them at all times.
- The Student Planner is used to record Praise Stamps and behaviour planner comments.
- Students are not allowed into lessons without it.

PRAISE Code

The Rewards System

- Ongoing departmental reward system
- Each department has their own style of stamp.
- It is expected that all good work will be rewarded with a stamp, very good work with two stamps and excellent work with three stamps.
- Students who have worked in lessons and been ON TASK, ON TIME, ON SIDE should receive at least one stamp per lesson.

PRAISE Code

The Rewards System

- Form Tutor Stamps
- Each week 3 stamps are issued by form tutors for students who have a clean sheet (no planner comments the previous week) and the planner signed by the parent/guardian. They **MUST** have both.
- Students are referred to attached members of the Senior Leadership Team for special praise as appropriate and are given stamps by the members of the Senior Leadership Team and the Principal on a weekly basis.

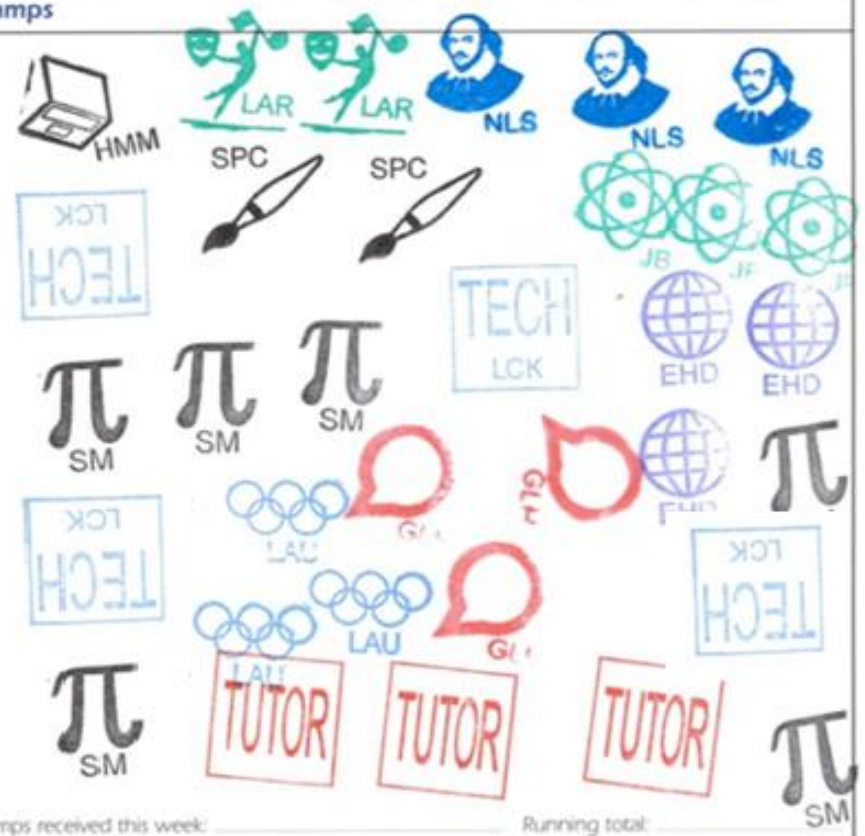
