Curriculum

Our philosophy is centred around knowledge acquisition allowing the development of subject specific skills where the teacher is the expert but the role of the learner is recognised as vitally important.

Challenging curriculum content is an entitlement to all students designed in the form of a spiral curriculum with regular low stakes testing and a consideration of cognitive load.

Our approach to pedagogy takes all these things into account with guided instruction, knowledge and vocabulary acquisition front and centre.

Assessment must create learning and most assessments will be formative and low stakes.


