

Remote Learning overview for students

Work will be set fortnightly. If a whole year group is working from home an outline of all the work will be shared via the one-drive curriculum materials folder and via Frog assignments.

There will be 3 elements to remote learning:

<Insert Year and subject> – Home Learning Activities
Below is the range of tasks that you should study over the next 2 weeks. Try and do the activities during the same lesson time slot that you have on your timetable. Each lessons worth of tasks should take you approximately 45 minutes. Before you start make sure that you have all the things that you will need. All work is to be found in this folder numbered in order – follow the instructions carefully.



- 1. Home Learning Tasks shared through the Onedrive; your 'normal' lesson activities.
- 2. **Assignments,** for marking and feedback, set via Frog assignments
- 3. Live sessions delivered via Teams for consolidation and revision; will be used, in the event of a whole year group working from home.

1.Home Learning Tasks – will be broken down into lesson sized 'chunks' between 30 and 40 minutes long. You


access the tasks from the classroom pages on the VLE.



Tasks will be found in clearly labelled folders that will match up with the instructions on the template; in most cases they will be in number order. They will be in 'fortnightly' labelled folders, make sure

you go into the correctly dated folders e.g HL02 21st Sept 2020 is for the 2 weeks starting 21st September.

2. Assignments – one assignment will be set fortnightly or more frequently if your teacher feels it is needed (except for '1 lesson a week' subjects). Keep checking your Frog assignments regularly. Instructions for any assignments will be included on the instructions templates. Feedback on assignments will be provided fortnightly, either directly linked to the Frog assignment you completed or via your e-mail; it just depends on the type of



assignment that has been set. (It's not a bad idea to check your Frog VLE and your e-mails daily)

3. Live sessions – will be used for the revision of home learning tasks if a whole year group has to work from home. They are optional and not lesson replacements. They will allow you to ask questions directly to the teachers running the sessions about your home learning tasks.

All sessions will be delivered through **Teams Meetings**, a weekly calendar of events will be shared; you will receive e-mail invitations to each event.

You will require an electronic device with a speaker (and a microphone for KS5 meetings). All sessions will be recorded and uploaded onto the one drive for additional support.

Other information

Communication – you will mainly be contacted via your school e-mail. In addition, if a whole year group is off school for 2 weeks or more, you will be contacted by your form tutor once every 2 weeks.

Assemblies - will be delivered via Teams meetings; e-mail invitations will be sent directly to your e-mail account.

What do you need to do?

- Check the website regularly
- Double check that you understand how to access the work, e-mails, your VLE and Frog assignments. We will be able to show you if you get stuck just contact your year teams.
- Find the best area to work that you can.
- Get into a good work routine. All families are different but it might help if you follow your normal timetable.
- Contact year teams for guidance and support if required
