INTRODUCTION

In 2013 the government made a commitment to provide additional educational funding to schools for each Year 7 student who had not achieved Level 4 in reading and/or mathematics at Key Stage 2.

In 2016 the eligibility criteria for catch-up funding changed to reflect the changes to end of KS2 assessments. Students are now eligible for catch-up funding if they scored less than 100 in reading and/or Mathematics.
